Investment objective

The objective of this Sub-fund is to provide its investors with a long-term appreciation of their capital, principally by means of a diversified portfolio of investments in equity securities and other similar instruments of issuers that the Sub-Manager believes have significantly more appreciation potential than downside risk over the long term. The Sub-fund may invest flexibly with no geographical limitation, including Emerging Markets. The Sub-fund promotes environmental and social characteristics according to article 8 of the Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 but does not have sustainable investment as its objective. The Sub-Manager believes that Environnemental, Social and Governance (ESG) consideration allows for long-term value creation, allowing to foster a positive change. The Sub-Fund may also invest in convertible securities. The Sub-Fund will generally invest in fewer than 50 securities. The Fund is actively managed, and the Fund's manager's discretionary powers are not constrained by the index.

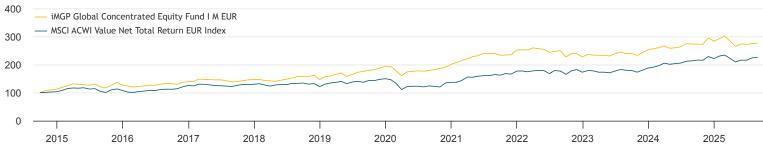

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Fund manager Comment

Highlights

-Global equities rallied in August, with the S&P 500 forward P/E remaining above the 90th percentile since 1990. Despite outperforming year-to-date, non-US stocks remain relatively cheap vis-à-vis the US in a historical forward P/E context. Coinciding with OpenAl's CEO saying investors have become overexcited about AI," industry observers are questioning the ultimate return on rapidly increasing GenAl-related capex. In August, the fund returned +2.7% vs. +3.2% for the MSCI ACWI Index in USD

Market Review

The outperformance of ex-US equities continued in August. The ex-US index (MXWDU) returned +3.5%, compared to +2.0% for the S&P 500, as ex-US Developed Markets outperformed (MSCI EAFE: +4.3%), while Emerging Markets lagged (MXEF: +1.5%). MSCI ACWI Value (+3.3%) outperformed Growth (+1.8%), partly due to underperformance of the Information Technology sector (MSCI ACWI IT Index: +0.4%), which carries a higher weight in ACWI growth (41%) than value (10%). Following recent U.S. tariff announcements and trade deals, the ultimate impact on trade, capital flows, growth, inflation, and borrowing costs is unclear.

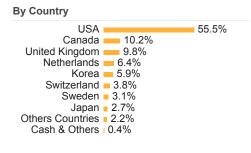
Fund Review

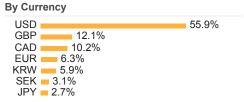
In August, the fund returned +2.7% vs. a +3.2% return for the MSCI ACWI Index in USD term. At the stock level, the top attribution contributors in August were Franco-Nevada Corp (+0.63%), Smith & Nephew (+0.48%), Novartis (+0.30%), Sony (+0.26%), and Occidental Petroleum (+0.25%). The largest detractors were Oracle (-0.70%), not owning Apple (-0.35%), Brookfield Corp (-0.28%), CME (-0.22%), and Markel (-0.21%). At the sector level, the leading attribution contributors in August were stock selection in Health Care (+0.64%), stock selection in Materials (+0.29%), and stock selection in Industrials (+0.28%). The leading laggards were stock selection in Information Technology (-0.93%), stock selection in Financials (-0.85%), and stock selection in Communication Services (-0.13%). On a regional basis, the fund outperformance vs. the MSCI ACWI index in August was led by stock selection in North America (+0.15%), stock selection in Japan (+0.15%) and stock selection in Europe (+0.10%), offset by stock selection in Asia/Pacific excluding Japan (-0.11%) and lower allocation to Japan (-0.10%). In the context of broad market concerns over both the US and global growth outlook, we remain confident in the earnings resiliency and fundamental prospects of our portfolio businesses. The weighted average trailing 10-year Adjusted EPS CAGR for our holdings was +9% vs. +5% for the MSCI ACWI Index.

Outlook

Various risks call the global economic outlook and broad equity valuations - particularly in the US, which remain high in a historical context - into question. These include ongoing trade policy uncertainty, fiscal "crowding out" and the questionable return on investment for elevated GenAl-related capex spend among mega-cap technology companies with high US and Growth index weightings. We seek to mitigate these risks by selecting companies across regions with top quartile low earnings volatility, sustainable growth potential, conservative balance sheets and high favorability to historical valuation ranges.
