Investment objective

The objective of this Fund is to provide its investors with overall total return consisting of a high level of current income together with long-term capital appreciation through a portfolio where (i) at least 80% of its net assets are invested in high yield debt securities, including convertible bonds and contingent convertible bonds, and (ii) at least two thirds of its net assets are invested in high yield securities (rating lower than Baa3) denominated in EUR. The Fund may invest up to 100% of its net assets in high yield securities.

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Fund manager Comment

Highlights

-European high yield tightened slightly in September, as both the Bank of England (BOE) and ECB held rates steady. The BOE slowed the annual rate of its QT program from £100bn to £70bn in light of mounting fiscal pressures and still elevated inflation. The US Federal Reserve cut rates by 25bp to 4.00-4.25% in September, the first cut this year, and indicated two more cuts are likely as labor market concerns rise.

Market Review

The ICE BofA Euro High Yield Constrained Index returned 0.54% in September. The index yield to worst tightened 10bp to 5.00% and the index spread contracted 15bp to 283bp in the month. BB-rated bonds returned 0.56%, B-rated bonds returned 0.63% and CCC-rated bonds lagged again, returning -0.35%. Pemex bonds rallied 2-3pts on a \$10bn tender backed by the Mexican government. Warner Brothers bonds rose almost 10pts on potential Paramount bid; Merlin Entertainment bonds gained 2-3pts after selling Lego centers for £200m. Worldline bonds, downgraded to HY and added to the index, fell 5-10pts amid an AML investigation and €150-200m ECB sales via CSPP.

Fund Review

The iMGP European High Yield Fund launched on the 31st July 2025. The Fund returned +0.3% in August and September underperforming the index by 23bp. Positive contributors included the Pemex 4.875% bonds due 2028, which were subject to the tender offer outlined above. The bonds, which were trading below par prior to the announcement, will be redeemed at par plus a 3pt early tender premium. Pemex, which has 5 EUR denominated bonds outstanding today, is now expected to leave the ICE BofA Euro High Yield Constrained Index post tender. Other top performers included bonds issued by real estate managers Alstria and Aroundtown, as well as bonds issued by ceramic components manufacturer Ceramtec, which continued their strong performance after the company reported better than expected results in August. The UK high yield market, as measured by the ICE BofA Sterling High Yield Index, lagged European high yield by c. 20bp in September on broader concerns about the UK fiscal environment and implications for consumers. The Fund has a c. 20% allocation to GBP-denominated UK high yield, which contributed to underperformance in the month. However, we still see compelling value in the asset class with the UK high yield index now trading at a 120bp spread discount to European high yield.

Outlook

The outlook is unchanged; spreads remain tight with bond trading levels vulnerable to earnings shocks as we saw in August. We remain vigilant to signs of tariff pressures, both at the broader economic and the individual company level. We believe that all-in yields of 5% are still attractive compared to an average of 4.5% over the last 10 years in a market supported by a strong technical bid for income-generating assets and limited default losses.
