Investment objective

The Sub-fund aims to provide long-term capital growth by investing in a wide range of asset classes and by offering a balanced exposure to equity and fixed income markets. The Sub-fund may invest, mainly through funds and worldwide, in equities, fixed-income instruments (such as bonds, notes and convertibles, including, on an ancillary basis, high yield, subordinated and inflation-linked bonds), as well as, to a lesser extent, in instruments offering exposure to commodities.

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The SRI (Synthetic Risk Indicator) is the indicator from the ESMA that replaced the SRRI on 1st January 2023. The SRI is calculated as the combination of MRM (Market Risk Measure) and CRM (Credit Risk Measure). Considering that the CRM scores the issuer default risk, which is extremely unlikely on a UCITS Product, the MRM will be the main trigger of the SRI score. The MRM (so the SRI) is a representation of the Market risk of the share class based on historical data (measured or proxied to a similar market risk) over the recommended holding period, unless stated otherwise.

The SRI will have a value from 1 (less volatile) to 7 (highly volatile).

Manager Comment

Highlights

- September was a positive month for equity and bonds assets classes, thanks to the first FED rate cut of 2025. Global equity performed well. UST yields declined. Gold surged to a new record of \$3,858/oz.

Market Review

September was positive for equities and bonds, driven by signs of U.S. labor market weakness that prompted the FED to implement its first rate cut of 2025. The August jobs report showed just 22,000 new jobs and a rise in unemployment to 4.3%, prompting the Fed to cut rates by 25 bps. Global equities rose, led by Emerging Markets equities, especially China and Brazil, and U.S. thanks to technologies stocks, while Swiss equities declined. U.S. Treasuries rallied, mainly at the long end, and corporate spreads were stable. Gold hit a record of \$3,858/oz. The dollar weakened slightly vs. CHF and EUR but strengthened against JPY and GBP.

Fund Review

The funds delivered a positive return in September, primarily driven by the equity allocation. U.S. equities were the main contributors, followed by Emerging Market, supported by an overweight in Chinese stocks. All other regional equity allocation contributed positively. The US stock selection was good thanks to Alphabet stunning outperformance. Diversification strategies allocation was the second main contributor, thanks to a strong appreciation of gold over the month. The Bond allocation provided a positive performance as well. Within the equity allocation, the Manager decreased exposure to EM equity by trimming the position in the iShares MSCI EM Asia ETF. This reflects the recent downgrade of EM ex-China, as the Managers decided to take profits on tech-related markets such as Taiwan/Korea. However, the Manager remains overweight China due to attractive valuation, and government support. Within the bond allocation, the Manager slightly reduced government bond exposure to increase investment-grade credit allocation by initiating a new position in the Vanguard USD Corporate Bond UCITS ETF. Additionally, Emerging Market bond exposure was increased through a new allocation to the Neuberger Berman Short Duration EM Debt Fund.

Outlook

Fundamental support for equities remains solid. The Manager expects earnings in 2025 to remain strong, primarily driven by the U.S. Looking to 2026, the Manager anticipates growth will become more widespread across sectors and while Europe will recover. The Fixed Income market presents an appealing setup, offering opportunities to benefit from yield carry without taking on excessive risks related to interest rate fluctuations or credit quality. Uncertainties on the inflation outlook and Fed's policy are balanced by downside risks to growth. Until there is greater clarity on inflation dynamics, economic growth trajectories, and fiscal policy direction, patience and selectivity remain key.

Portfolio composition

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1-year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period. Actual annual figures are available to the investor on request.

Highest & Lowest return: The highest and lowest returns for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Alpha: Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund.

Average Credit quality: The weighted average credit quality of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund (internally calculated).
